### RURAL HOSPITAL MEDICINE REGISTRAR – HAWERA HOSPITAL

<b>SPECIALTIES COVERED:</b>	

- Rural Hospital Medicine – Hawera Inpatient Ward, Hawera Emergency Department (ED)

#### TEAM COMPOSITION:

- There is one Rural Hospital Consultant on duty each day and one Rural Hospital Registrar or Rural Hospital Medicine House Officer (minimum PGY 2) in the in-patient ward or ED. There is one Consultant or Medical Officer of Special Scale (MOSS) in the Hawera ED 24/7.

#### CLINICAL RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:

- Attending inpatient daily ward rounds with Consultants/ Senior Medical Officers.
- The day-to-day clinical management of the in-patients in Hawera Hospital.
- Assessing and managing patients in the ED as directed.
- Rural Registrars are required to attend to any “medical emergency” when on duty.
- Rural Registrars participate in the admission and clerking procedures of acute and elective patients and subsequent discharge plans
- After hours, the Rural Registrar is responsible to the supervising ED Consultant or MOSS on duty

- Liaison with other specialties including (but not limited to) general practice, medical, surgical, orthopaedic and paediatric.
- Communicate with patients and their families including attending/facilitating meetings.
- Keep accurate and legible clinical progress notes.
- Undertake practical procedures appropriate to their competency level.
- Instigate treatments as directed/supervised by the Consultant/ MOSS.
- Work as an integral part of the interdisciplinary team both in the inpatient and outpatient areas and attend outpatient clinics with specialists visiting from Base Hospital.
- Complete appropriate discharge paperwork in a timely manner.
- Assist with M&M meeting preparation and execution.
- Assist with audit preparation and execution.
- Undertake research as agreed with the Clinical Lead.

#### TRAINING AND EDUCATION:

- This run provides for the completion of the Rural Hospital Medicine Training Programme.
- Consultants provide a comprehensive series of tutorials throughout the attachment.
  - General Medical teaching every Wednesday 1230-1330hrs via VC.
  - Clinical Grand Round every Thursday at 1230-1330hrs via VC
  - Emergency Department teaching every fortnight on Thursday mornings 0830-1030.

#### HOURS OF WORK:

- Ordinary hours of work are Monday-Friday 0800-1600hrs.
- After hours cover is one long day 0800-2000hrs per week.
