If you need advice during your pregnancy, you can ring the labour ward at Taranaki Base Hospital on **0800 169 2229 and select 1**. They will liaise with your midwife and the Antenatal Clinic.

If it is an **emergency** and you need an ambulance ring the labour ward and they will organise it. You will not be charged for the ambulance if this happens.



Why have I been referred to the hospital for my antenatal care?

You may have a medical condition, such as diabetes or a high risk pregnancy such as twins which requires close monitoring by an obstetrician and transfer of clinical responsibility for care.

Often you will still have input from your own midwife, this will be discussed at the first appointment.

Referral to the hospital Antenatal Clinic means the specialist and clinic midwife can monitor your blood tests and ultrasound scans, and respond quickly if there are any complications.

Where will I go for my antenatal care?

If you live in the New Plymouth area all specialist antenatal care is undertaken at the Maternity Unit at Taranaki Base Hospital.

If you live in South Taranaki you will attend all your Antenatal appointments at Hāwera.

Your labour and birth will be at Taranaki Base Hospital, with either your own midwife or the Te Whatu Ora Taranaki midwife. (This will be discussed with you during your pregnancy.)

You will usually see the same specialist obstetrician for your care. However, when you come in for the birth of your baby you may be attended by another obstetrician.

Do I still see a midwife?

Yes you still need to see a midwife.

Either your own midwife will provide ongoing midwifery care or it will be provided by the Te Whatu Ora Taranaki midwifery team. This decision will be made by a three-way conversation with you, the obstetrician and the midwife as to who is the right person to provide midwifery care.

Your LMC or specialist will discuss your thoughts and plans for pregnancy and support you to make informed decisions about your labour and birth.

How often do I see a midwife?

Midwife visits happen between visits to the obstetrician and aim to give you a normal focus on your pregnancy.

After the first appointment the following visits with either the Antenatal Clinic midwife or your LMC will enable you make decisions and preparations for labour, birth, feeding your baby and preparing for taking your baby home.

If the hospital team have been doing your antenatal care, once you have had your baby the midwife that originally referred you will continue your postnatal care. If you didn't have one, the antenatal clinic midwife will help you find a midwife in your area.

When you come in for labour or for monitoring outside of normal antenatal clinic hours you are cared for by a hospital midwife.
